

# **President/Vice President Candidates**



### 1. Philip Rumore President

It is truly an honor to serve and to battle alongside the finest and most dedicated teachers anywhere.

Together we have negotiated a three-year contract that:

- Raises the MS +30 maximum from \$77,666 to \$96,401;
- Eliminates 2-year hold steps at 15, 17, 19, 21; teachers are no longer held at these steps for 2 years – there are now steps at 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22;
  • Rejected 15% healthcare payment for a fixed dollar amount;
  • Provided a substantial SBF increase that has enabled a
- significant increase in dental and optical benefits;

Yes, there were some trade-offs; however, I hope you will agree that they were far eclipsed by our gains. The battles ahead:

- School Board Elections All nine (9) seats will be voted upon. Need I say more?
- Negotiations The district will continue its attempts to divide us and impose unacceptable proposals, while we continue the fight for teaching and learning conditions that are safe and that foster learning.

And we will never give up until Buffalo teachers receive the wages and benefits that reflect your dedication to our students despite the obstacles you face.

- APPR Continuing the battle to remove student test scores from the APPR.
- Receivership Ending the labeling of under-funded schools as "Failing" based upon student test scores. Let's start labeling New York State as failing for underfunding our schools. The Buffalo Public Schools are owed over \$1,000,000,000 in Foundation Aid.
- Over-sized classes; the lack of school counselors, attendance teachers, social workers, psychologists, ENL teachers, etc.
- Insufficient vocational/technical programs, art, music and physical education.

Yes, we have challenges ahead; however, as always, we will meet them head-on and we will not stop until they are overcome.

As always, I, as are you, am ready for the battles. I am just as driven as I was on the day you first elected me to be your president - for which, I remain honored. Once again, I say "Bring them on!"




